LETTER OF UNDERSTANDING

CHANGES TO THE USE OF ALTERNATIVE LEARNING TECHNOLOGIES IN 2020-21 DUE TO COVID-19 PANDEMIC

The Parties agree that this Letter of Understanding forms part of the 2018-2022 Faculty Collective Agreement for the life of this Collective Agreement.

Whereas the Collective Agreement contemplates that a Unit's normal collegial decision making will be used to determine the introduction of a credit course or courses using Alternative Learning Technologies (ALTs);

And whereas the COVID-19 pandemic, the Declared Emergency and its impact on the University has required the University to transition to emergency remote teaching delivery for the final 4 months of the 2019-20 academic year and into the 2020-21 academic year;

And whereas in the circumstances, the Parties recognize that the University's centralized decision to deliver all courses (with few exceptions) using remote teaching was necessary;

The Parties agree to the following provisions:

- 1. Clause 5.1 of the *Implications of Technology* Article shall be waived from March 13, 2020 to June 30, 2021 to allow for the introduction of a credit course or courses using Alternative Learning Technologies (ALTs) to be determined outside of the Unit's normal collegial decision making.
- 2. All provisions in the *Letter of Understanding Online Courses*, including Clause 2, shall continue to apply.
- 3. This Letter of Understanding is without prejudice or precedent to any other matter between the Parties.
- 4. The Parties will revisit this Letter of Understanding by March 15, 2021.
